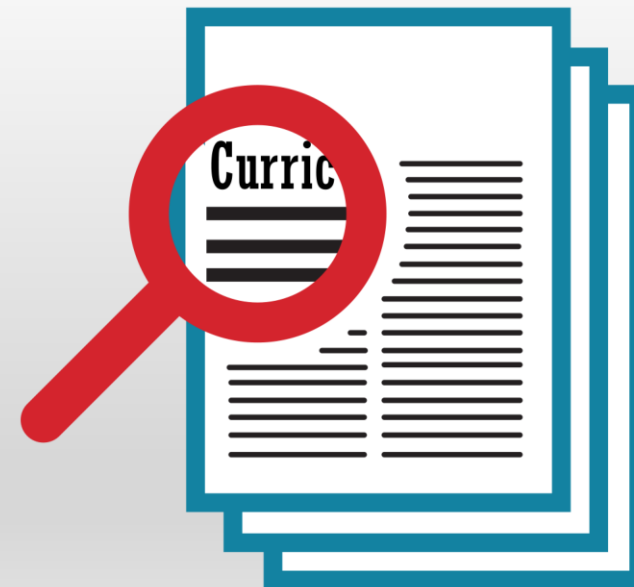


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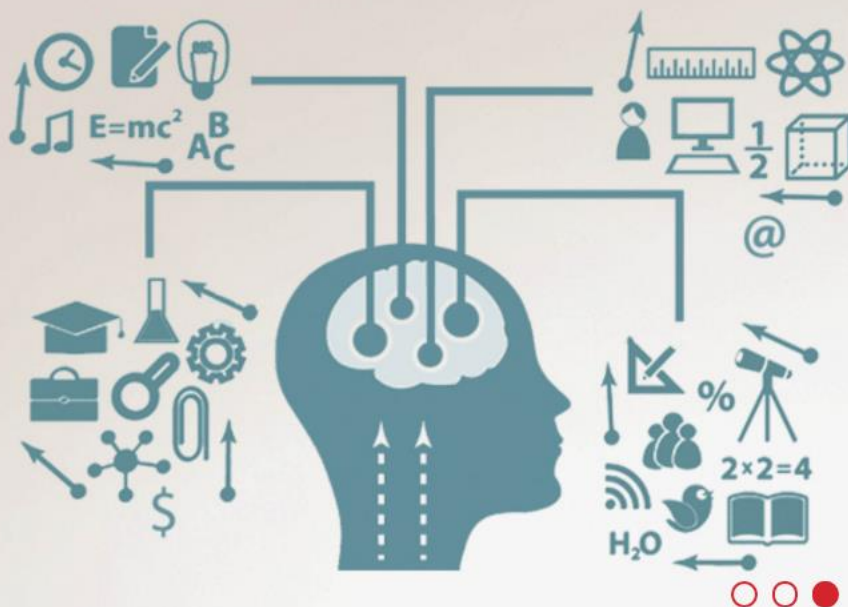

Our Mission

The Ed Snider Center for Enterprise and Markets believes that teachers are vital to helping students develop the critical thinking skills America needs to sustain enterprise and innovation in future generations. Literature can help them do that. To help high school teachers use literature to excite students about the principles of enterprise, the Snider Center has teamed with the Cato and Ayn Rand Institutes to create the Enterprise through Literature (ETL) Program. ETL connects teachers and experts to share ideas on how literature can speak to students about the intersection of the individual, the market, and society. One of the most exciting ETL programs is the summer workshop that brings high school teachers to the Smith School for an intense two-day workshop. Seventeen teachers from all around the country took part in this summer's inaugural workshop, "Fostering the Entrepreneurial Spirit," and left inspired by new ways they can use literature to incorporate themes of enterprise into their curricula. **ETL is expanding!** Later this year, the ETL program will launch a national student contest on enterprise. In the spring, we will debut an on-line professional development course that connects teachers with expertise and resources to help them develop and execute curricula in the classroom.

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
